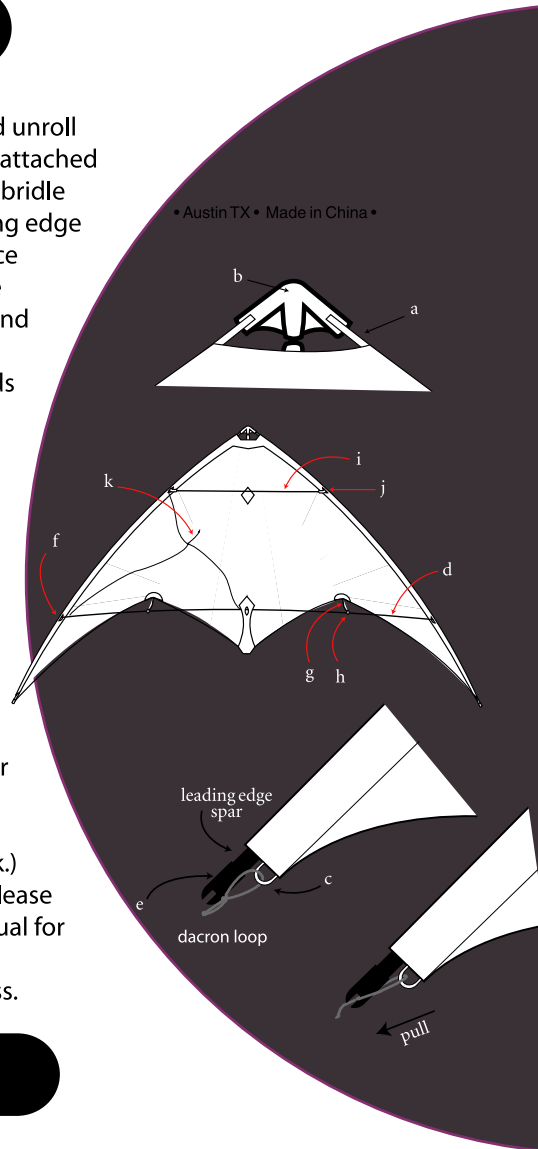


Assembly

Remove kite from bag and unroll in front of you so that the attached spar (lower spreader) and bridle line face you. Insert leading edge rod (a.) fully into nose piece (b.) on both sides. Pull the dacron loop (c.) onto the end nock (e.) so that the sail is tensioned. Insert both ends of the lower spreader (d.) into the leading edge connectors (f.) and ensure that the bridle comes off all points evenly and is not wrapped around the spars. Insert the standoffs (g.) into the standoff connectors (h.) located on the lower spreader. Insert both ends of the upper spreader (i.) into the upper spreader connector (j.). Attach flying line to the bridle connection point. (k.) using a Larkshead knot. Please refer to the included manual for further details and flying instructions by Dodd Gross.



Tips & Tricks!

Use all of the kite line. Have a friend there to help you launch the kite while you are learning. Try to keep your arms relaxed by your sides while flying. Don't raise your arms over your head. Use small movements while learning and try not to over control your kite. Do not exceed the kites recommended wind speed.
